Home Learning projects for Puffins and Ducklings

* **English** - Research Africa and create an information poster about what the country is like or what animals live there.

Maths— Doubling and Sharing and Fraction—Cut a pizza (or something similar) in half and then quarters and you could even try cutting into eighths. Take some photos as you go along and then print out and label.

DT—Draw some different fruits and vegetables from the outside. Next cut the fruit and vegetables in half and draw the inside. You could even try a new fruit or vegetable at home.

PSHE—Look at a variety of different coins and notes at home. You could then visit a shop and help to count out the coins/ notes for the amount that has been spent. How about drawing around the coins or even trying coin rubbings.

Science - Plants—Draw a picture of a plant and label the different parts (include roots, stem, flowers, seeds and leaves). Go for a walk and start to identify the different types of trees.

History—Go for an adventure in your local area and see if you can find something that wouldn't normally be there.—Be an explorer for a few hours.

Computing—Create a flip book using very simple pictures.

R.E—Ask an adult to read you the story of **Feeding the 5000** or watch it on YouTube. Have a go at making a 'model' of it in playdough or using small world figures, pattern blocks, lego, dolls/cuddly toys, etc. If you can't bring your model into school, ask an adult to take a photograph of it. Try to write a sentence about what happens in their story.

We have however, been fortunate to have found a replacement, Ms Anderson, who will teach Kingfisher Class on Mondays and Tuesdays, Miss Pettifor on Wednesdays, and myself on Thursdays with our usual rotation arrangement on Fridays. I will oversee what is taught on these days and continue to monitor the pupils' progress closely. Mrs Young is also joined in class each day by Mrs Roberts, two extremely experienced Teaching Assistants whom the children know well. If you have any concerns or questions throughout the term, please come and speak with me.

Our Learning

English

To inspire our writing, we are using the video clip 'Viking Village' from Literacy Shed, which is a great fly through video to help children visualise what a Viking village may have looked like, leading to writing focusing on descriptive language.

Maths

The Year 3 pupils are completing the Spring term unit Mass and capacity and the Year 4 pupils are completing the Spring term unit Decimals. The children will be doing some extra maths to ensure the curriculum is covered by the end of the term as they will learn about time, money, shape, statistics, position and direction.

Science

Our topic is Light . The children will learn to recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light; they will learn that light is reflected from surfaces; and recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes. Children learn how to recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by an opaque objects; and they find patterns in the way that the size of shadows change.

<u>History</u>

We are enquiring into whether the Vikings were raiders or peace-loving settlers?

<u>Art</u>

Our theme is painting and mixing media: Light and dark.

PSHE

We are learning about safety and the changing body.

<u>RE</u>

Christianity: Is the cross a symbol of love, sacrifice or commitment for Christians?

Home-learning

Choose at least 2 of the following:

Maths—Practise telling the time at home using analogue and digital clocks. You could keep a diary of what you do at certain times of the day.

Science—investigate how shadows change throughout the day. Find an object to stand in a sunny place in your garden or outdoor area. Either stand it on a large sheet of paper to trace its shadow or use chalk on the ground. Go out each hour to see how the shadow has changed. Bring your sheet of paper into school or take a photograph of your chalkings.

History—make a model of a Viking Longboat.

PE—Practise your tennis skills. You can play against a wall if you do not have a partner to play against. If someone can film you, make a video of you delivering a coaching session, explaining how to serve, do backhand and forehand.

RE— Make a 3D cross. Design and make a new cross for the Worship Table.

Art—towards the end of the half term, apply your knowledge of colour mixing and painting techniques to create a still life painting of a collection of objects of your choosing.

Useful Ways to Share Learning at Home

Practise telling the time at home and get used to counting money in real-life situations.

Make sure your child reads for at least 15 minutes an evening—this makes a huge difference to their reading age.

Please ensure your child uses TT Rockstars every night for 10 minutes.

Please make sure they learn their spellings and practice every day for them to go into their long term memory.

Practise their brass instrument as this is the final term that the children will have whole class brass lessons.

Key dates and routines to remember:

PE kits need to be in **EVERY** day.

Spellings are tested on a Monday and new spellings are given out on a Monday.

Whole class brass lessons continue every Thursday.

The Year 4 multiplication check will be between Monday 3 June and Friday 14 June.

Our Learning

English

To inspire our writing, we are reading The Journey by Francesca Sanna, which is an emotional picture book that raises the issues families in war torn areas face. The children have already written incredible poems this week, and we will also be writing diaries, narratives, letters and balanced arguments about refugees. We are revising spelling, punctuation and grammar everyday, and continuing to read Goodnight Mister Tom.

<u>Maths</u>

We are covering decimals and their relation to fractions and percentages this half term and then moving onto statistics. Year 6 are also revising many areas of Maths each day in preparation for SATs.

Science

Our topic Is Earth and Beyond, involving the study of planets (their movement around the Sun and characteristics), how the Earth moves and the movement of the Moon.

Geography

We are studying deserts: where they are located, what a hot desert biome is, physical features and the threat to deserts.

<u>Art</u>

Our theme is "I need space," and we are critiquing space imagery, different techniques and mediums and then creating our own imagery inspired by Teis Alber's "Moonwalk."

PSHE

We are learning basic first aid and then moving onto puberty and sex education (year 6 only).

RE

Buddhism: How does the Triple Refuge help Buddhists in their journey through life?

Home Learning

Maths revision booklets have been given to Year 6. I have said they need to do some each week and bring it in to me every Wednesday. I done this so that they don't leave it all to the last minute and panic. If your child is stuck on any part, then they can bring it to me for help on any day.

Year 5 will be given Maths homework next week..

English homework has been given to Year 5; Year 6 will be given revision work to do on grammar and reading comprehensions to prepare them for SATs.

Chose 1 or more task from the following:

Science—find out how astronauts live in a space station—what do they eat, how do they sleep, what tasks do they have to do etc. The children could present their findings in a power point or poster.

Geography— make a diorama of a desert.

Art/Design — design a make a space buggy model in whatever materials you like or create a painting of a planet in our universe.

R.E— Design a t-shirt for yourself with a symbol of what you think will really help you in life. Add the slogan: I take refuge in Write / video yourself explaining your t-shirt.

More projects to follow soon.








Collective Worship
