Home Learning projects for Puffins and Ducklings


- **English** Create poster about a place you like to visit. The poster could include information about what you might like to do when you stay there i.e. a good park, swimming pool etc. Your poster could even be about a place you like to go on holiday to.
- **Maths** Time—Design and make your own clock and make the hour and minutes hands. Then have fun testing your family.

Art—Make a 3D map of your house or local area.

- **PSHE** Diversity—Draw a picture of yourself and then a friend who is completely different to you i.e. might be hair colour / style, clothes, etc. Write notes as to what is different.
- **Science** Plants—Grow something at home and create a diary to show the changes over time. You might like to draw the seed / plant at different stages and then label.
- **History**—What school was like in the past—Interview a family member about what school was like in the past. Get a grown up to help you to write down your questions and their answers.
- **Computing**—Create you very own stop motion video. Use the app 'I can animate' to record and then email so it can be shared with the class.
- **R.E**—Either make a display all about JOY, showing what makes you joyful and add as many ways you can that the Torah makes Jewish people 'joyful'. Or make a giant scroll which tells the story of Moses.

Our Learning

<u>English</u>

Our learning will be based on the book 'Oliver and the Seawigs'. Oliver Crisp's parents are explorers and for 10 years they have travelled the world, taking Oliver with them. Now they have decided that all the great unknowns have been seen and they are ready to return home. To their surprise they discover a dozen mysterious islands in the bay near their house. They pull out the dinghy and immediately set off to explore whilst Oliver begins to unpack. When he goes out to check on them, the islands are gone and so are his parents. That is why a boy who dreams of staying home and going to school winds up on yet another amazing adventure, in search of his missing parents.

<u>Maths</u>

The pupils will learn about fractions, money, shape, statistics and position and direction this half term.

Science

The children will study a unit called 'Scientific Enquiry' which takes children through six lessons where they learn the scientific skills they will need to apply during each unit of learning during key stage 2.

Geography

We are investigating what rivers are and how they are used.

Design and Technology

Pupils will analyse and evaluate a range of existing fastenings, then devise a list of design criteria to design, generate templates and make a fabric book sleeve.

<u>PSHE</u>

We are learning about safety and the changing body.

<u>RE</u>

Sikhism–How does the teaching of the gurus move Sikhs from dark to light?

Home-learning

Choose at least 2 of the following:

English—find out about a great explorer, in the past or in modern times; or study legends of the sea, such as mermen, mermaids and sea monsters drawing parallels between the story Oliver and the Seawigs and real life events.

Maths—Properties of 2D shapes for Year 4s and Properties of 3D shapes for Year 2s and 3s—sheets will be put on the website or paper copies can be printed off.

Science-

History—investigate a local river, even visit it if you can. Where is it's source? What is the river used for? Which towns or villages does it pass through? Can you find the river on an OS map? Where does it enter the sea?

PE—Practise your athletics skills in preparation for sports day. Practise dribbling a football, skipping, get someone to time you running to see if you can improve your times.

RE— Paint or draw large pictures of Guru Nanak for a gallery.

Art—towards the end of the half term, apply your knowledge of colour mixing and painting techniques to create a still life painting of a collection of objects of your choosing.

Useful Ways to Share Learning at Home

Practise telling the time at home and get used to counting money in real-life situations.

Make sure your child reads for at least 15 minutes an evening— this makes a huge difference to their reading age. Please ensure your child uses TT Rockstars every night for 10 minutes.

Please make sure they learn their spellings and practice every day for them to go into their long term memory.

Practise their brass instrument as this is the final term that the children will have whole class brass lessons.

Key dates and routines to remember:

PE kits need to be in EVERY day.

Spellings will be tested on a Thursday this half term and new spellings will be given out on a Thursday.

Whole class brass lessons continue every Thursday.

The Year 4 multiplication check will be between Monday 3 June and Friday 14 June.

Our Learning

<u>English</u>

We are editing and improving our writing this half term. We will also be writing balanced arguments and descriptions. The stimulus for writing will be The Journey, which is about a family of refugees, various pictures and film clips.

Spellings will continue to be given out weekly and then tested the following week. Spellings are always stuck into reading diaries. Your child's login for Spelling Shed is stuck at the front of their reading diary. Please encourage your child to use this programme as those who are doing so, are remembering their spellings and scoring higher marks.

<u>Maths</u>

We will be finishing off statistics, then year 5 will be learning about angles and year 6 will be studying algebra and ratio.

Please ensure your child uses TT Rockstars at home regularly. The login is stuck in the front of their reading record.

Science

We are finishing Earth and Space and moving onto living things and their habitats, particularly the life cycles of different animals.

Geography

We are completing our topic about deserts this week and then moving onto The Ancient Greeks as a History topic.

<u>Art</u>

We will be designing and making pop up books.

PSHE

Year 6 will have Sex Education and we shall also be learning about transition and how to prepare for change.

<u>RE</u>

Humanism-Why do Humanists say happiness is the goal of life?

Home Learning Projects

The expectation is that children will complete a minimum of 3 pieces of homework to bring into school by the end of each half term. Worksheets will be put on the class pages of the website for parents to download or paper copies available upon request.

English— Learn your lines for the play.

Maths— Learn a times table every week for daily tests to improve the speed of recall. Children will be told which we are revising.

Science – Chose an animal to research and make a poster or power point about their life cycle.

History—research an aspect of Ancient Greece you are interested in and present your findings to the class in any format you wish.

Art – Create a drawing or painting of a Greek God or Goddess.

PSHE—Year 6—Create a list of questions you have about moving school and any worries or concerns you may have. Year 5 - create an advice sheet for what it is like being in Grebes Class, for the Kingfishers who will be moving up.

R.E- Redesign the humanist logo as a 'secular', atheist or agnostic logo and give an explanation for your design. Does it convey the right meaning? Or Create a Humanism artefact box. Write a guide to Humanism with key facts about Humanist beliefs / practice to put in the box along with explanations of the items you have included.

Useful Ways to Share Learning at Home

Look at the moon and stars at night, maybe try to spot a shooting star.

Make sure your child reads for at least 15 minutes an evening— this makes a huge difference to their reading age.

Suffolk Show Schools' Garden Competition

Launched in 2015, the Schools' Show Garden Competition gives schools the opportunity to design and build a 1.5m x 1m show garden to reflect the theme which is different every year.

The theme for 2024 is "An Olympic Themed Garden and the children at Tattingstone Primary have really enjoyed this exciting project.

All children were invited to take part in the competition and three of our KS2 children have seen the project through from start to finish. They started by planning how they wanted the garden to look and what plants they would like to grow / buy for their design by what was in the garden centres at this time of year. They researched the plants and looked at what would be good for the bees and butterflies and then wrote some information sheets about the plants.

As part of the theme the children also wanted to paint a number of flags on the stones for some of the countries that were competing at the Olympics being held in Paris this year. Children have thoroughly enjoyed planting and selecting where to put their posters and the painted stones. Our raised bed was of interest to judges and visitors to the Suffolk Show and we were awarded Bronze.
