Our Learning this Half Term

Kingfishers Class Parent Newsletter Autumn (2) 2024

Dear Parents,

We hope that you have had an enjoyable half term—it is lovely to have the children back in class and so eager to learn. We have now finished our topic on The Tudors and have moved on to our wintery theme exploring the Alps. We will be reading the book The Ice Palace by Robert Swindells, which is an old folk tale that follows Ivan through his quest to discover what happened to his brother. Alongside this, we will be exploring what life is like in The Alps and how it compares to the UK.

Below is the summary of what we will be covering this half term in each subject.

Our Learning summary

<u>English</u> Whilst studying The Ice Palace, we will be focusing on descriptive and non-fiction writing as well as some poetry.

<u>Maths</u> We are learning about multiplication and division for this half term with Miss Daines & measurement, length and perimeter with Mrs Derrett.

<u>Science</u> Evolution and inheritance— We have started considering what features we might inherit from our parents as well as how adaptations happen over time.

<u>Geography</u> The water cycle and use of rivers, followed by What is life like in The Alps? We will be finding out how life in The Alps compares to that in the UK.

<u>DT</u> Navigating the world—We are going to be designing, making and then pitching our own navigation devices.

<u>Computing</u> We will be learning about data handling in computing this half term.

<u>RE</u> We are studying Islam this half term, covering what the Qur'an reveals about Allah and his guidance.

Useful Ways to Share Learning at Home

Enjoy books with your child – even 5 minutes a day is fine. Let them see you reading & highlight the purpose of reading i.e for pleasure, to read menus, to buy tickets, to find information out.

Ask your child to 'do the shopping' for you. They can write a list, estimate the cost, help you collect the items, pay the total (using cash is great but not always possible) and then work out the change if using cash.

Practice your child's spellings with them each day for their weekly test on Monday.

Go on a nature walk; focus on the texture of things, the noises they hear, the different habitats.

Allow your child some 'down time.' This means evenings or weekend days where they do nothing structured. Academics believe that an element of boredom helps to develop a child's creativity, resilience and independence.

Turn off all electronic devices at least one hour before bedtime. This includes TV. Encourage your child to read in bed or read/make up bedtime stories with them.

Tuesday: County Music lesson (bring instrument if it has been loaned to you)

Wednesday: PE (PE kit)

Friday: PE (PE kit)

Please can children bring in their reading book and reading diary every day so we can listen to them read and enter them into the reading raffle.

The children are welcome to bring items for show & tell any day – We cannot promise we will get time every day but will try our best. Please do encourage your child to share any recent achievements such as a new swimming group, trying something new, a certificate. Please remind your child that show and tell items are not to be played with in school.

Our Learning this Half Term

Grebes Class Parent Newsletter Autumn (2) 2024

Dear Parents,

I hope that you have had an enjoyable half term—it definitely feels like winter is on its way and the evenings have got darker very quickly. Although we have finished our topic on The Tudors we have not yet finished our class book 'Treason' so we will finish this before moving onto our new book 'Shackleton' which is always a favourite. To accompany our wintery theme we will be exploring the Alps as part of our geography topic after learning about the water cycle and use of rivers. Alongside this, we will be exploring what life is like in The Alps and how it compares to the UK.

Below is the summary of what we will be covering this half term in each subject.

Our Learning summary

<u>English</u> We will continue to read Treason which will include writing in role, drama and role play and even a Tudor dance! It also means each child is heard reading aloud every day. Shackleton's Journey will enable pupils to explore dilemmas, empathising with characters and to produce a range of writing in response to the text through role play and dramatisation.

<u>Maths</u> We are currently learning about multiplication and division but will move onto fractions before returning to multiplication and division at the end of term.

<u>Science</u> Evolution and inheritance— We have started considering what features we might inherit from our parents as well as how adaptations happen over time.

<u>Geography</u> The water cycle and use of rivers, followed by What is life like in The Alps? We will be finding out how life in The Alps compares to that in the UK.

<u>DT</u> Navigating the world—We are going to be designing, making and then pitching our own navigation devices.

<u>Computing</u> We will be learning about data handling in computing this half term.

<u>**RE**</u> We are studying Islam this half term, covering what the Qur'an reveals about Allah and his guidance.

Useful Ways to Share Learning at Home

- Please read with your child on a regular basis. Encourage them to read independently every day and remind them to take guizzes at school as this will help improve their comprehension skills.
- Please encourage your child to do times table rock stars every day for 5 minutes. It will help them learn
 their times tables and also access the Maths curriculum more easily. The Year 6 expectations are so
 much harder for children to attain without fluent recall of times tables.
- Encourage your child to use spelling shed to practise their spellings.
- Practice your child's spellings with them each day for their weekly test on Monday.
- Encourage children to watch the news and be aware of world-wide events.
- Encourage your child to pack their school bag and check they have their reading book, PE kit etc to encourage independence and prepare them for high school.
- Turn off all electronic devices at least one hour before bedtime for a good night's sleep.

Key dates and routines to remember:

- PE is on a Wednesday and a Friday. Children must have their kit in school everyday.
- Music is on a Tuesday. Please bring any loaned instruments to school on this day.
- **Spellings** will be tested on a **Monday** and new spellings given out then also. New spellings are stuck into their reading records.

- Thursday 14th November—Grebes class assembly at 2.50pm.

Eco-Council






